One of her favorite activities was taking my dad to a local drive through fish place on Thursdays to get their catfish. They would then go and park in a shade somewhere to eat.

My mother was not perfect, but she was the perfect mother for me. She loved God, she loved her family, and she loved all the students she taught. She loved her neighbors and all her friends. She was a giver. She gave her time to volunteer, her money for the causes she believed in, and her prayers for those she loved and those she didn't like so much. She lived the good life, she fought the good fight, and she is home now.
